MRS FLORA MACAULAY

Mrs Flora Macaulay, the visionary editor of the post second world war Oban Times, recognising that there was little competition for clubs after the completion of the Sir William Sutherland Cup and the Camanachd Cup (the final being played in April at that time) presented a fine silver trophy for competition amongst "all the senior shinty clubs of Scotland". The first round of the competition was to be played in June with the final in July.

In December 1946 the Macaulay Cup Association held its first meeting with Archie MacInnes, Oban's Town Clerk and a former Ballachulish player, as President and Donald Cameron, the advertising manager of the Oban Times as Secretary. Founding committee members were Major Harry Dunn, Archie Gillespie, Bob MacLachlan and Walter Paterson.

Twenty one clubs entered the first competition by the closing date of the 15th of February 1947. The first final in which Newtonmore defeated Ballachulish 4-1 attracted a crowd of 4000, the largest up to that date which had attended a match at Mossfield Park.

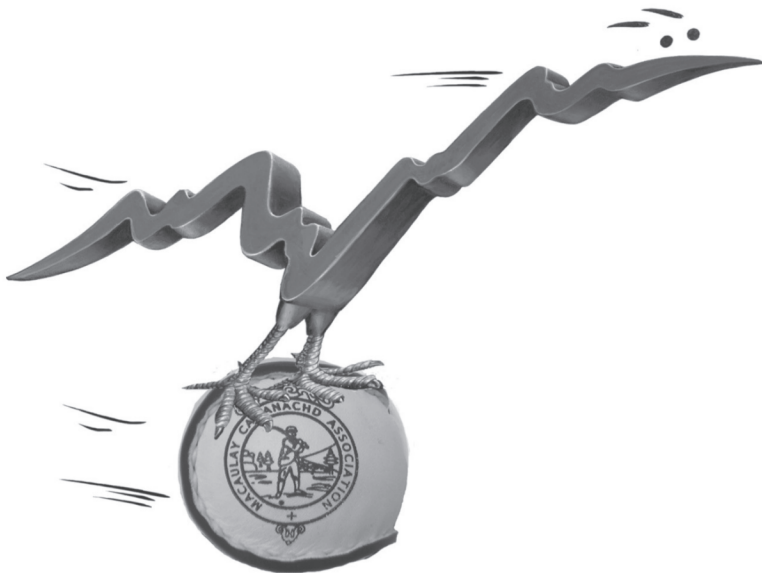
